## **Approach to Homeschooling**

- As much as possible, try to teach the whole family together.
- My children teach them self by about age 12 and I check their work.

## **Tips for Living Frugally**

- Have a goal in mind. It does not need to be a daily or weekly goal but, "What do I want to accomplish by Christmas?" Then reevaluate at Christmas.
- There is no such thing as getting behind in homeschooling. Just keep on going.
- You do still need to hold your children accountable for their work.
